INTRODUCTION: EPHESIANS

A GENERAL OVERVIEW OF EPHESIANS

The Author: The letter of Ephesians was written by the apostle Paul (1:1).

When was it written and who for: Ephesians was written around 62AD when Paul was imprisoned in Rome (3:1, 4:1, 6:20). It was written to the church in Ephesus (1:1), who Paul visited twice and spent quite a bit of time with (Acts 18:19-21 and 19:1-20:31). Even though it is written to the Ephesian church, its message is one that applies to Christians in all places and times.

Themes and Purpose: The purpose of Ephesians is to remind the church of the work of Jesus and how that impacts the life we live today. Throughout all this, Paul reminds them of the unity that they have in Christ as well as the unity that is shared between the body of Christ the Church.

WEEK 1: EPHESIANS 1:1-14

Read Acts 19:23-41

- 1. What do you learn from this passage about the culture in Ephesus when Paul was there?
- 2. What happens to Paul and his travelling companions?
- 3. What can this incident teach us about what the Ephesian church may have been experiencing?
- 4. In what ways is this different, of similar to our culture today?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

WEDNESDAY

Read Acts 20:13-37

- 1. How does Paul describe his ministry amongst the Ephesian church?
- 2. How would you describe his relationship with them?
- 3. What does Paul command the Ephesian leaders to do?

Read Ephesians 1:1-2

- 1. What do you learn about Paul in these verses?
- 2. What do you learn about the recipients of the letter in these verses?
- 3. How does Paul greet them?
- 4. What is the significance of 'grace' and 'peace' for Christians?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

FRIDAY

Read Ephesians 1:3-14

- 1. What overwhelming picture of God do you get in this passage?
- 2. Is God being in control something that you doubt in your life? When and why?
- 3. Why does this passage direct us to praise?
- 4. What does this passage teach you about God's sovereignty? What hope and peace does it offer?

SATURDAY AND SUNDAY

WEEK 1 GC STUDY: EPHESIANS 1:1–14

How can we develop a culture of praise in our GC's, church, families, and personal lives?

Considering what we learn about how people are saved in this passage; how does this affect the way we do evangelism today?

Read 1 Thessalonians 1:11-12

- 1 What things does Paul pray for the Thessalonian church?
- 2 What are the similarities and differences between this prayer and the one in Ephesians chapter 1?
- 3 How can this prayer inform your prayer life and what you pray for?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

FRIDAY

Read Ephesians 1:1-23

- 1 What is the connection between verses 3-14 and verses 15-23?
- 2 What is the main thing that you learnt from this passage? Or what is the main thing that struck you from this passage?
- 3 Considering this, are there any changes you need to make in your life?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

SATURDAY AND SUNDAY

WEEK 2 GC STUDY: EPHESIANS 1:15-23

How would you describe your prayer life? Why do you pray and what do you pray for?

READ EPHESIANS 1:15-23

What is the reason for Paul's prayer for the Ephesians?

How would you sum up what Paul asks for in his prayer?

Why would Paul ask that the Ephesians would grow in wisdom and enlightenment? What is the hope that this kind of prayer will achieve?

How does Paul describe Jesus in this passage?

Think back over your prayers in the past days/weeks. What has motivated you to pray? What have you prayed about?

What can you learn from Paul's prayer about how to pray? Are there some things that you need to change about your prayer habits to reflect this in your life?

How do you think having 'the spirit of wisdom and of revelation' (verse 17) would affect your life?

Do you think this prayer can ever be fully answered in this life? What does this teach us about ourselves, God and Jesus?

WEEK 3: EPHESIANS 2:1-10

- 4. Can you remember the time in your life when this described what you were like?

Read Ephesians 2:4-7

- 1. What reason is given for what God has done for us?
- 2. What has he done for us? How and why has this all been made possible?
- 3. How have you seen the movement from 'dead in transgressions' to 'alive with Christ' in your life (verse 4)?

Read Ephesians 2:8-10

- 1. How does Paul describe grace in this passage?
- 2. What is the ultimate purpose for God showing this grace (see verse 7)?
- 3. How are Christians described in this passage? How does this differ from what the world around us teaches?

Read Hebrews 10:19-25

- 1. How is the new life in Jesus described by the writer of Hebrews?
- 2. What is the response that we are to have because of this new life?
- 3. How does this passage help you further understand the good deeds that God wants us to do (Ephesians 2:20)?
- 4. How are you going at doing 'good works' (Ephesians 2:4)?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

FRIDAY

Read Romans 3:21-31

- 1. What similarities are there in the way that Paul describes Gods saving work in Romans and Ephesians?
- 2. What differences are there in the way that Paul describes Gods saving work in Romans and Ephesians?
- 3. What is one thing from what you have read and learnt this week that has struck you? Spend some time praying and thanking God for this.

SATURDAY AND SUNDAY

WEEK 3 GC STUDY: EPHESIANS 2:1-10

What is one of the best stories that you have heard of someone who has gone through a complete life transformation? What was so significant about this story that made it stick with you?

Why do you think Paul adds "raised" and "seated in heavenly realms" to "made alive" (see 1:1:19-23)?

Why is it so key to have grace at the center of our lives? What could happen to your faith if you lose sight of God's grace?

How do you feel about being 'God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works' (verse 10)? Is this how you would describe your life? Why or why not?

What do you think are the 'good works' that God wants you to do in your life (eg Hebrews 10:24-25, Ephesians 4-6)?

- 1. How does Paul describe what Jesus achieved in his death (as a tip, there is a specific word that is repeated)?
- 2. What do all Christians have access to?
- 3. Would you describe Christianity as a place of peace? Why or why not?
- 4. How does this affect how we do evangelism today?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

WEDNESDAY

Read Ephesians 2:19-22

- 1. How are the Ephesian church further described in this passage?
- 2. What is the foundation of the church?
- 3. How is the church described by Paul in this passage?
- 4. What are the implications of these truths for Summerleas church?

Read 1 Corinthians 3:10-23

- 1. How does Paul describe the church in this passage?
- 2. What is Paul warning the Corinthian church against?
- 3. What are the similarities between this passage and Ephesians 2:11-22?
- 4. How can you help there to be no division within Summerleas Church?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

Read Ephesians 2:1-22

- 1. What are the two main changes that Paul describes in chapter 2?
- 2. How have these changes been made possible?

What is the reason for the church, and the foundation of the church?

Considering what you have learnt in this passage, what implications are there for how we treat each other?

What difference would this make to those who are watching the church and looking in?

Would you describe Summerleas church as a 'holy temple' (verse 21) and 'a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit' (verse 22)? Why or why not?

How can you help Summerleas church be the place that God designed it to be?

- 4. How can we see God's plan from the Old Testament played out in history?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

TUESDAY

Read Ephesians 3:7-13

- 1. Why did Paul go into ministry (see also verse 1) ?How does Paul further describe his ministry in this passage? How has his ministry been made possible?
- 2. What is God's purpose and how is he going about fulfilling this?
- 3. How does all of this relate to the suffering that Paul is experiencing?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

WEDNESDAY

Read Ephesians 3:14-21

- 1. What sort of things does Paul pray for the Ephesian church?
- 2. Why do you think Paul asks God for these things (see verse 14)?
- 3. Spend some time writing out this prayer in your own words and praying it.

Read Ephesians 1:15-23 and Ephesians 3:14-21

- 1. What are the similarities and differences between Paul's prayers for the Ephesians?
- 2. What difference would it make in our lives to fully understand the love of Christ?
- 3. What can you learn from the prayers of Paul that can help you in your own prayer life?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

FRIDAY

Read Ephesians 3

- 1. Twice in this passage Paul mentions 'For this reason I..." (verse 1, 14). How does this help us further understand Paul's teaching in Ephesians 1-3?
- 2. How would you describe the purpose of the church?
- 3. Do you see this happening at Summerleas church? Why or why not?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

SATURDAY AND SUNDAY

WEEK 5 GC STUDY: EPHESIANS 3

What would you say to someone who said that their Christian faith was personal and individual and that being part of a church was irrelevant?

READ EPHESIANS 3

What is the mystery that has now been made known to Paul and through him the world?

What reason does Paul give for his ministry and his suffering?

How would you sum up what Paul prays for the Ephesian church?

Read Ephesians 4:7-13

- 1. What do these verses teach about our differences as Christians?
- 2. Who are the gifts given by? What is the significance of this in terms of how we use our gifts?
- 3. What is the purpose and fulfillment of these gifts?
- 4. How are you going at growing in maturity in Christ?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

WEDNESDAY

Read Psalm 68 & Ephesians 4:7-11

- 1. How is God described in this Psalm? What is David specifically praising him for?
- 2. What is David, the Psalmist, asking God to do in this Psalm?
- 3. Who does Paul ascribe these verses from the Psalm to in Ephesians?
- 4. How does this help add to your view of Christ?

Read Ephesians 4:14-16

- 1. What illustrations does Paul use to depict a mature church? How do they help us understand what he is saying?
- 2. How do truth and love help build maturity?
- 3. How are you going at speaking truth and loving people at Summerleas? What changes could you make to grow in these areas?

Read Ephesians 4:1-16

- 1. Considering this passage as a whole, what is Paul exhorting the Ephesian church to be like?
- 2. Why do you think unity is such a big deal for a church to have?
- 3. How can you help Summerleas church to be a church that is unified?

- 4. What is something that you can do to help grow in this area?

Read Ephesians 4:17-5:2

- 1. What is the ultimate thing that Paul exhorts the Ephesians Christians to be?
- 2. Do you consider yourself to be an 'imitator of God' (5:1)? Why or why not?
- 3. How can you 'live a life of love' (5:2) more in your daily life?

WEEK 7 GC STUDY: EPHESIANS 4:17-5:2

"What one believes will show in what they do." How can you see this truth played out in the world today?

Paul mentions twice in this passage to have thanksgiving to God (verses 4, 20). What difference does a thankful heart have to living a holy life? How can you cultivate this type of thanksgiving more in your life?

Would you describe yourself as someone being 'filled with the Spirit' (verse 18)? Why or why not?

How can we help each other to live out the life that Paul describes here?

READ EPHESIANS 5:22-6:9

How does Paul describe the following relationships & what reasons does Paul give for acting this way:

- Husband relate to their wives?
- Children to their parents?
- Fathers to their children?
- Slaves to their masters?
- Masters to their slaves?

What does this passage teach us about Christ and his relationship to the church?

How is the Bible's teaching and understanding of submission different to that of the worlds (see also Philippians 2:6-11)?

Why do you think it is so hard to put others before ourselves?

Is self-sacrifice something that is evident in your own life?

Which of these relationships described in this passage relate to you? How can you take on Paul's commands here to grow in this area?

- 4. How can you take up the 'armor of God' in your life?

Read Ephesians 6:18-20

- 1. What is Paul's final command for how to fight the 'devil's schemes' (verse 11)?
- 2. Considering your prayer life, is this how you pray and are these the things that you pray for?

Read Ephesians 6:21-24

- 1. What is the reason for Paul sending Tychicus to them?
- 2. What does this show about the relationship between Paul and the Ephesian church?
- 3. How does Paul's final greeting to the church summarise the message of his letter?

Read Ephesians 1-6 (skim reading)

- 1. How would you summarise the main message of Ephesians?
- 2. What is something that has really spoken to you from this letter?
- 3. Considering this, what is one thing that you have been challenged to change and work on from what you have learnt?

What would you say is the biggest battle that Christians face?

READ EPHESIANS 6:10-24 Who does Paul say in this passage are the real enemies of Christians?

What does Paul say to do in order to fight against these enemies?

List the six pieces of the 'armor of God'. What does each one signify and how would they help fight against the enemy?

What importance and significance is given to prayer in this passage?

How do you see the 'devil's schemes' (verse 11) play out in our world and in your life?

What is the thing in your life that you think poses the greatest threat to your faith? What steps can you take to ensure that you will never desert the gospel?

What do you need to do in order to be fully equipped with the armor of God? Are there any changes you need to make in your life?

How can we help each other be 'strong in the Lord' (verse 10)?

GC PRAYER POINTS

WHOLE FAMILY LEARNING (WFL) IDEAS FOR EPHESIANS

1 We have everything we need in God (Ephesians 1)

- Ask the group to list some things that they think they need. Maybe write up some of the responses on a whiteboard/butcher's paper.
- Ask someone to read Ephesians 1:3-13
- Brainstorm together all the things that the passage says we have from God. Maybe write these up on the whiteboard/butcher's paper as well.
- Ask what are the differences that people notice in the different lists? Which one sounds better?
- Spend some time praying and thanking God that he has given us all that we need!

2 Prayer (Ephesians 1)

- Ask your GC what they pray about when they pray. Try and get as many members as possible to share.
- Get into groups of 3/4 people. Give each group some paper and pencils. Spend some time in the groups drawing what they are thankful for. Give each group about 5 minutes then share as a big group.
- Read Ephesians 1:15-23 in the same groups. Maybe use a version that is easier for the younger members of your group to understand. You could use the ERV version. Discuss together and write on paper what Paul prays for and why they think he asks for these things. Give each group about 5 minutes to do this, then get the groups to share what they thought.
- Spend some time praying as a group together.

3 God's Grace (Ephesians 2:1-10)

- Play a game together that is totally not fair! Where the person who doesn't deserve it win's. It could be Pictionary, where the team that loses gets a prize or something along those lines.
- Ask someone to read Ephesians 2:1-10.

- Ask the following questions:
 - What were we once like?
 - What are we now?
 - How is this possible?
 - Is this 'fair?'
- Spend some time praying together thanking God for his grace to us.

4 Unity amongst believers (Ephesians 4:1-16)

- Get into groups and ask the following questions (one at a time) for each group to answer and then share the answers (you could reward the group for the best/funniest answer)
 - What if your foot all of a sudden decided it didn't want to be a foot anymore...what would happen?
 - What if your head decided it didn't want to be a head anymore...what would happen?
 - What if someone started fighting with people in church and not being nice to God's family? What would happen?
- Ask each group to read one of the passages below and talk in their groups about what it teaches about God's family. Share back what they discussed after a couple of minutes.

a) Ephesians 4:1-6, b) Ephesians 4:11-13 c) Ephesians 4:14-16

• Spend some time in prayer asking God that we will have unity at Summerleas Church.

5 Old Self/New Self (Ephesians 4:17-5:4)

- Get some old baby clothes (or just clothes that are too small) and try and put them on, or ask others in your group to try and do it. Spend some time having fun with this and giving people a go.
- Ask the group why it didn't work.
- Ask someone to read Ephesians 4:17-5:4
- Draw a 'put off' and 'put on' list on a whiteboard/butchers paper and ask the group what different things are to go in each category from the passage.

- Then ask, why is there this difference between the two?
- Spend some time praying that God would help you put on your new self.

6 The Armor of God (Ephesians 5:10-18)

- Read the passage together
- Split up into groups and have a go at drawing the armor of God. Share as a big group each other's drawings. Could give a prize for the best one/most creative etc if you want.
- Give each group one of the elements to think through and discuss amongst themselves how it would help fight against Satan. Then come back together as a whole group and ask each group to share what they thought.
- Spend some time in prayer together.
