INTRODUCTION: EZEKIEL

A GENERAL OVERVIEW OF EZEKIEL

The Author: Ezekiel was an Israelite priest and prophet taken to Babylon among the first captives in 598BC.

When was it written and who for: The prophesies were given and presented to the Israelite people by Ezekiel from 593BC (Ezekiel 1:2) until 571BC (Ezekiel 29:17), during the fall of Jerusalem and captivity to Babylon.

Themes and Purpose: The book of Ezekiel is a series of prophetic visions and oracles that announce the fall of Jerusalem due to her sin and disobedience. Themes included within this are:

- God's holy wrath and sovereignty, as well as his mercy and compassion. "They will know that I am the Lord" is a repeated phrase throughout the book of Ezekiel, showing God's desire for his name to be known not only in Israel, but to all the nations.
- The loss of the land and God's presence among them.
- The promise of the Holy Spirit as part of covenant faithfulness.

- 1. How is Israel described by God in this passage and why won't they listen?
- 2. What does God command Ezekiel to do?
- 3. How have you encountered people rejecting God's word today? How does this affect your personal evangelism?

THURSDAY

Read Ezekiel 2:8-3:15

- 1. What does God command Ezekiel to do?
- 2. What is the significance of the scroll and how it tastes?
- 3. What is it that helps Ezekiel?
- 4. What does this passage teach us about evangelism today and the possible opposition we may face?

FRIDAY

Read Ezekiel 3:16-27

- 1. What does it mean for Ezekiel to be a 'watchman for the house of Israel' (see Jeremiah 6:17-21)?
- 2. What will happen to those who do not listen to God's warnings?
- 3. What is the reason for God making Ezekiel mute? What is the significance of this?
- 4. What do these verses teach you about God in regard to his justice and power?

WEEK 1 GC STUDY: EZEKIEL 2:1-3:27

What are some of the biggest challenges you face with personal evangelism in your life?

READ EZEKIEL 2:1-3:27 What roles are given to Ezekiel (see also 1:3)?

How are the Israelites described in this passage? How do they respond? to Ezekiel's message and why?

'The hand of the Lord was upon me' (1:3; 3:14, 22) is repeated throughout this section of Ezekiel. What do you think this means for Ezekiel?

What different things does the Spirit do to Ezekiel throughout this passage? What do you think are the significance of these things?

What do you think it means to be a 'rebellious people'? How do you see this playout in the world today?

'People do not reject God's word because it is too hard to understand, but because they do not want to obey it'. Do you agree or disagree with this statement?''

Considering your answers to the above two questions, what affect does this have on the way that we do evangelism?

What comfort can we have when we talk about God to those around us?

- 1. What happens to the Israelites? What would this have meant to them?
- 2. What reason is given for this?
- 3. Considering this, and what you have learnt from Ezekiel chapters 4-7, how seriously does God take disobedience towards him?
- 4. Are there ways in your life that you are continually disobedient towards God? Spend some time repenting of this and asking God to help you turn from this.

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

What mention does 'the nations' have in chapter 5? What is the significance of this?

What do you learn about God's character and what he thinks of sin in this chapter?

Do you have a similar view of sin? Why or why not?

If we viewed sin the same way God did, how would this show in the way that we live?

Read Hebrews 4:14-16. What hope do we have in Christ in this passage? What are we to do in response to this?

Read Ezekiel 16

- 1. How does God describe his relationship with Israel?
- 2. Considering how God describes Israel in this passage, what sense do we get of what God thinks of people being unfaithful to him?
- 3. What response should we have when presented with our unfaithfulness?

WEDNESDAY

Read Ezekiel 17

- 1. What sin is Ezekiel specifically rebuking here?
- 2. What do we learn about God's purposes and the actions of men (see verse 22-24)?
- 3. How do you respond to the sovereignty of God? Is it something that brings you fear or comfort? Or both?

THURSDAY

Read Ezekiel 18

- 1. How is a righteous person described in this passage? What is their reward? What is the opposite of this and what will be the result?
- 2. What happens to a repentant person?
- 3. What is Israel's complaint to God? How does God respond to this?
- 4. Have you turned to God and repented of your sin? If so, is this something you continue to do daily? If not, what is holding you back?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

Read Ezekiel 19

- 1. This chapter describes 3 kings in Israel's history. Try and identify who Ezekiel is referring to and what they all have in common.

- 2. What is the purpose of showing the sinfulness of the kingship within Israel and thus the purpose of this lament?

As God's covenant people, what were the Israelites meant to look like? See Deuteronomy 5:1-21

What should have been Israel's response to hearing these words?

What words of hope does God offer to the Israelites in this passage? (see verse 60-63). How has God worked this out in history?

What similarities does our world today share with the Israelites at this time (Read Romans 3:9-18). Considering this, what is God calling all people to?

Have you repented to God and received his mercy and grace through Christ? If so, think of one area that you have noticed particular change. If not, what is holding you back from doing this?

Consider Ezekiel 16:36 and Luke 18:14. What is our response to be to God's salvation work?

As God's new covenant people, how does God now call us to act? (see 1 Peter 2:9-13)

- 1. How does God accomplish his judgement on Israel?

- 1. What has Israel become to God? Why have they become like this?

Considering this, what does that mean for us today? (see Romans 8:10-11)

Give one example of how the new life that Jesus has given you has changed the way you live?

What are some ways that you can be more open to the Spirit working in your life?

MONDAY

Read Ezekiel 40-41

- 1. What is being described in this passage?
- 2. What does the layout of the temple teach you about God? (see diagram opposite)
- 3. Why was Ezekiel not able to enter the inner sanctuary? Contrast this to Hebrews 9:6-9 and the privileges we now have.



TUESDAY

Read Ezekiel 42-43

- 1. What characteristic of God is emphasised by this description of the temple?
- 2. What behavior does God expect in response to this vision of a new temple?
- 3. How is this vision fulfilled? (see John 2:18-22)
- 4. Considering this and our belief in the cross, what type of behavior should we exhibit?





- 3. Read Hebrews 10:4-18. What light does the New Testament give to the purpose and fulfillment of sacrifices?
- 4. Considering this, how are we to now live our lives? (see Hebrews 10:19-25).

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

THURSDAY

Read Ezekiel 46-47:12

- 1. Where does the river flow from and what effect does it have?
- 2. Read Revelation 22:1-5. What are the similarities and differences in the way the rivers are described?
- 3. Considering this, what is the meaning of this river for the Israelites and for us today?

FRIDAY Read Ezekiel 47:13-48

- 1. How was the land to be divided up?
- 2. What gospel truth is foreshadowed here? (see Ephesians 2:11-13).
- 3. What does this teach us about what God's plans for Israel and the world were from the beginning?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

SATURDAY AND SUNDAY

If you missed any studies throughout the week, you can do them on these days.

WEEK 10 GC STUDY: EZEKIEL 43:1-11

When you think of the work of the Holy Spirit what comes to mind?

READ EZEKIEL 43:1-11 What is it that fills this new temple? And how is it described?

What is Ezekiel's response to what he sees?

What is the significance of God's glory coming into the temple (see Ezekiel 10:18)?

What behavior are they to have in response to this?

Considering where the Israelites were and what was happening to them at the time of the prophecy, what do you think hearing this would have meant to them?

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How do we see Ezekiel's prophecy fulfilled in Jesus? (see John 2:18-22, Hebrews 9:15 and Revelation 21:22).

Read Ephesians 2:18-22. How does this describe what Christians are?

How is our reality now better than what was available to the Israelites?

Do you think of your body as one where the Holy Spirit dwells? Why or why not? Have you experienced times in your life which can only be understood by the Holy Spirit working in you?

WHOLE FAMILY LEARNING (WFL) IDEAS FOR EZEKIEL

1. Read 'God's promise remains' (pages 211-227) from the big picture story Bible.

Ask the following questions (depending on the age of your kids):

- What did the different prophets write about?
- Why were the people sad?
- Who is this forever king?

Pray together about what you have talked about.

2. Read 'Born Again' from The-ology (page 151) and Ezekiel 36:26

Ask the following questions (depending on the age of your kids):

- What kind of heart will God take away from his children and what kind of heart will he replace it with?
- What does it mean to be born again?
- How does this happen?

Then **pray** together about what you have talked about.

You could **watch** these video's and **ask** what they learnt about the book of Ezekiel or found helpful and discussion can go from there.

Pray about what you have learnt.
